

Let me start with how thrilled and privileged I am to be joining the staff of Bridgeport UMC. This church has a long tradition of quality music and I look forward to helping carry that forward!

My name is Brett Miller and I have lived in Buckhannon since I moved there from Lancaster, PA to attend West Virginia Wesleyan College in 2002. I graduated in 2006 with dual degrees in religion and music performance (clarinet). It was also at Wesleyan where I had three special opportunities: to take up organ with Dr. Melody Meadows; to sing in choirs conducted by Dr. Larry Parsons; and to take a choral conducting class taught by Sarah Carr Parsons. All these experiences (and people) fostered a love of sacred and choral music which continues to this day.

After a minor post-graduation existential career crisis, I took a job at the Wesleyan library in 2007, enrolled in library school at a certain regionally unpopular university in western Pennsylvania (ask a WVU football fan if you aren't sure which one), and graduated with a master's degree in library and information science in 2011. My specialization was in archives, preservation, and records management and I was named Wesleyan's first official archivist in its history upon graduation. I was later named the director of the Wesleyan library in 2017. After four years, I was offered an opportunity to move into the private sector as the Director of Research at Orion Strategies, a strategic communications and government relations firm based out of Buckhannon. I also continue to serve as the Methodist archivist of the West Virginia Annual Conference, based out of WV Wesleyan.


